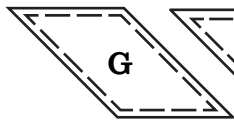


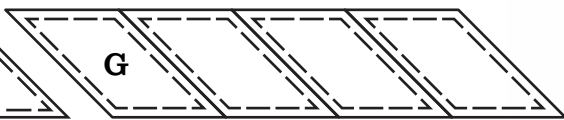
**Quilt Block E**

(31" x 31")

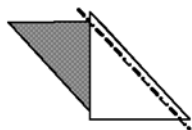
## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

**Dark fabric:** Quilt as shown requires  $1\frac{1}{8}$  yards  
(Cut 32 G parallelograms)

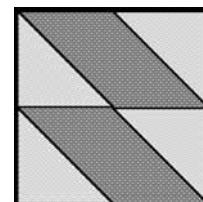
**Light fabric:** Quilt as shown requires  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yards

## SEWING DIRECTIONS

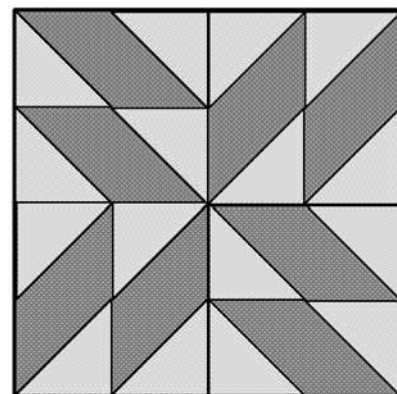
1. Layout two right triangles E and one parallelogram G for one block unit as shown.



2. Pin and sew triangles to parallelogram, right sides together, with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. The bottom tip of the triangle will align with the corner of the parallelogram. The top tip will extend beyond the parallelogram by  $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
3. The sewn unit should measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".
4. Press seams toward parallelogram.
5. Make a total of 32 block units.
6. Pin and sew two block units together as shown. Make 16 combined block units.
7. Press seams open.
8. Lay out four combined block units to form one block.
9. Pin and sew together.
10. Press seams open.
11. Make a total of four blocks.
12. Lay out four blocks to complete quilt center. Press seams open.
13. Add  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " cut narrow borders of dark fabric.
14. Add 5" cut outer borders of light fabric.
15. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
16. Pin or baste.
17. Quilt as desired.
18. Sew binding to quilt, mitering corners.
